Jadaliyya's NEWTON (New Texts Out Now) section features interviews with writers of recently published and forthcoming books, articles, and translations, along with short excerpts from these new works.

The idea of NEWTON is to provide readers with a brief background of a new text, and to help readers to find out about a work that they might not otherwise encounter.

We seek NEWTON submissions that are lively and engaging. Polemical pieces are very welcome. NEWTON submissions should ideally be 1,000-2,000 words. We love to receive posts that incorporate links, imagery, and video clips.

Submission Specifications:

Please ensure the following is included with the article:

- An image related to the content of the article. The size must be 300 by 400 pixels, and a specific source must be included.
- 2-3 quotes from the article and include in the .doc file at the of the submission.
- Comma-separated tags at the bottom of the article based on what the post is about: e.g., Egypt, revolution, protests, army.
- Hyperlink words in the article if they refer to links on the internet. We encourage hyperlinks. Please avoid footnotes & embed them as hyperlinks if possible.
- Sign and email the copyright Release Form ([download here](#))

Developing a NEWTON article:

To develop a submission for NEWTON, work with an author, and develop questions for the author's work. Questions should be brief and intentionally general so authors may describe whatever they would like about their texts. The questions are simply tools to help introduce readers to the text. Authors are invited to include an excerpt from their book and any images or links they would like (Including a link to the publisher's page for the book, if applicable.)

Possible Questions for NEWTON authors:

1. What made you write this book?
2. What particular topics, issues, and literatures does it address?
3. How does this work connect to and/or depart from your previous research and writing?
4. Who do you hope will read this book, and what sort of impact would you like it to have?
5. What other projects are you working on right now? (if you'd like to talk about other work in progress or recently published)
6. EXCERPT FROM THE BOOK (if you want to include this)

Review Process:

Articles are reviewed by NEWTON'S editorial team. The decision-making process is by consensus. If an article requires further development an editorial member reviews the article and comments are then sent to the author for review. The review process varies from hours to weeks depending on the extent of edits necessary and culminates in the publication of the article.
